Cyber Security Awareness “Kids Safe Online” Poster Contest

The State of West Virginia is participating in the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center’s (MS-ISAC) national K-12 Computer Safety Contest. This contest is to encourage young people to use the Internet safely and securely and to craft messages and images that will best resonate with their peers across the country.

Poster Art should illustrate the safe use of the Internet and/or mobile devices. Create original artwork that demonstrates one of the following concepts →


- Not giving out personal information on the Internet
- Interacting with others and not bullying or threatening others on the Internet
- Only visiting safe websites
- Being careful not to download malicious code from games or websites
- Protecting against identity theft
- Safe use of social networking such as Twitter, Facebook, MySpace, etc.
- Being careful with email (not sending worms and viruses)
- How online gaming and gambling can be dangerous
- Any original concept that illustrates safe use of the Internet or mobile devices

Submission Deadline: February 10, 2013

Posters must be 11 inches by 8.5 inches (horizontal) and will be judged on the following criteria: creativity, originality, poster concept and adherence to technical specifications. Any entry that infringes upon copyright or contains any trademark images or links for brands such as Disney Characters, Dell, Google, Twitter, Facebook, etc. will not be judged.

The contest is open to all public, private or home-schooled students in kindergarten through twelfth grade. The top three winners from the state in each grade group (K-5, 6-8, 9-12) will be submitted to MS-ISAC for entry into the MS-ISAC National Poster Contest.

Winning entries of the National Contest will be included in the MS-ISAC 2014 Calendar, which is distributed to every state in the country as part of the MS-ISAC Cyber Security Awareness Toolkit. Entries received may also be used in other national, regional and state cyber and computer security awareness campaigns. Prizes are awarded to all state finalists.
